A BIT OF HISTORY

In 1944, the Supreme Headquarters Allied Expeditionary Force (SHAEF) were based in Jullouville. Staffs of approximately 11,000 soldiers (including 4,000 British soldiers) were stationed at Chateau de la Mare and the adjacent buildings, under the leadership of the Allied Expeditionary Forces Supreme Commander, General Eisenhower - with one purpose in mind: the Liberation of Europe.

Granville and Jullouville were liberated the same day, on July 31st 1944. Exactly 75 years later, Piper Operation Cobra will commemorate this extraordinary act of courage by the Allied Forces.
